Litho Print Process

A thin metal plate etched with an image or text is inked, it then transfers that image or text onto a blanket which in turns transfers the ink onto the paper stock. In the packaging industry this is usually a sheet fed process for folding cartons, books, posters, greeting cards and print ads. There are web based presses which are used for newspapers, business forms, catalogs, encyclopedias and magazines.

Below are some of the reasons chosing litho label could be the right fit.

Benefits:

- Best for short to medium box runs
- One box with different facing labels
- 1-8 color printing w/ varnish on labels
- Highest level of print quality
- Line screened images at 100 200+
- Tight plate to plate registration no traps

Things to watch for:

- There are sheet size limitations, 80" max
- Only a few IP plants can covert litho labels
- Higher per unit production costs

Litho Label

Printed litho sheet is adhered to the outside liner of a combined sheet of corrugated

Printed Litho Sheet

Outside Liner

Combined Board

A separate sheet of paper is printed using offset lithography
Adhesive is applied to the underside of printed sheet
The label is then laminated to the outside liner of a combined sheet
The labeled sheets are then cut and scored at the die-cutter on a full die-board
A label may cover a portion of one panel, a full panel or several panels of the box
A label could cover the entire box or tray depending on blank size

Litho Lam

The litho sheet is adhered directly to the flute tips and is now the outside liner

Printed Litho Sheet

Medium

Inside liner

or single Face Litho-Laminate

In this process the litho sheet becomes the outside liner of the box or tray
Requires a special machine called an Asitrade to glue top-sheet to single face
Adhesive is applied to the underside of the litho top-sheet then
it's attached to the flute tips of the single face
Less top sheet cracking over scores than with conventional box labeling
